"Truly included" - Family and non-kin carers in hospice and palliative care

The culture of hospice care needs to truly include family carers as central in their relationship with patients and as worthy beneficiaries of support both during and after the death of the patient

Goals:

to explore the ideal, the current practice and necessary changes to "truly include" non-professional carers in the end-of-life care

Questions that we want to cover:

- How do we **perceive** family carers: as the primary carers, as equal partners, as those who need us (maybe more than the patients)? How do our images shape our cooperation?
- How do we assess the resources and needs of family carers and how do we integrate them in the care we offer? Do we give them enough, too much, the right services?
- Who are "non-professional carers" in the various settings? Which (new) groups do we need to focus more on? Child/young carers, non-kin as friends and neighbours, non-kin as volunteers, other professional carers such as "live-in" paid carers?
- What are areas of conflict and possible prevention strategies? (e.g. professional ethos vs. normality)
