Leadership in Hospice and Palliative Care

In hospices and palliative care units, multi-disciplinary teams are made up of experts, trained staff and laymen. The organizational culture is often dominated by values such as compassion on the one hand and a pioneering spirit, often resulting from historical roots. In many cases, leadership in such teams seems to be a privilege of leading experts. But as organizations grow, mature and diversify, a different concept of leadership may be more useful and even necessary.
